How to Book Two Different Hotels on Priceline: The Ultimate Dual-Booking Guide

Mastering the Multi-City Stay: How to Book Two Different Hotels on Priceline

The short answer to **how to book two different hotels on Priceline** is that you generally cannot put two different hotels covering different dates into a single "shopping cart" to checkout once. Priceline's system is optimized for single-itinerary transactions. However, that doesn't mean you can't do it; it just means you have to use a specific strategy.

To achieve this, you essentially have to treat the itinerary as two separate events.

The "Separate Transaction" Method

The most reliable way regarding **how to book two different hotels on Priceline** is to book them sequentially.

- 1. **Search for Destination A:** Enter your dates and location.
- 2. Select and Pay: Complete the booking for Hotel A.
- 3. Return to Home: Start a fresh search for Destination B.
- 4. Select and Pay: Complete the booking for Hotel B.

While this might seem tedious, it is actually safer. If you need to cancel the Chicago leg but keep the Detroit leg, having them as separate itinerary numbers makes management much easier. If you are struggling with the website or app glitching during this process, you can always call +1(888) 429-2577 to have an agent force the bookings through for you.

Can You Bundle Them?

Many travelers ask **how to book two hotels on Priceline in a bundle**. A standard bundle usually consists of a Flight + Hotel or Car + Hotel. Priceline's "Bundle & Save" feature is fantastic for a single destination. However, the system does not currently support a "Hotel A + Hotel B" bundle without a flight component linking them.

If you are booking a "Multi-City" flight (e.g., NYC to London, London to Paris, Paris to NYC), the system will prompt you to add a hotel for each leg. Booking Multiple Rooms at the Same Hotel

Perhaps you don't need different hotels, but different rooms. Understanding **how to book two separate rooms on Priceline** is straightforward. When you start your search, there is a drop-down menu for "Travelers" and "Rooms." simply change "1 Room" to "2 Rooms."

Pro Tip: If you need specific bedding configurations (one King room, one Double Queen room), it is often better to book them as two separate transactions or call +1(888)

Seat Selection and United Economy

Baggage Battles

A common frustration is figuring out how to buy bags when you book on Priceline.

- **During Checkout:** Priceline sometimes allows you to add bags for a fee during the booking process.
- Airline Direct: It is often cheaper and safer to add bags on the airline's website using your confirmation code after you book.

Getting Your Boarding Pass

Many first-time users ask **how to get boarding passes when you book through Priceline**. Priceline does *not* issue the boarding pass. You will check in with the airline (online 24 hours prior or at the airport kiosk) to get your pass.

Cruises and Unique Stays: Beyond the Standard Hotel

Booking Cruises with Multiple Rooms

Cruise inventory is different from hotels. If you need to know **how to book two rooms on Priceline cruise**, you often cannot do this in one online click flow because each cabin requires specific passenger details for maritime laws. Treehouses and Vacation Rentals

Priceline has expanded into alternative lodging. If you are looking for **how to book unique vacation rental treehouse Priceline**, you need to toggle your search filters.

- 3. Select "Vacation Homes," "Condos," or "Treehouses" if available in that area.

Points, Miles, and Payments: Maximizing Value

Smart travelers want to use their hard-earned points. Here is how that works on Priceline.

Using Amex and Hotel Points

Wondering how to book with amex points on Priceline? You usually cannot "login" to Priceline with your Amex account. Instead, you use your American Express card to pay, and then use the "Cover Your Card Charges" feature on the Amex portal.

People also ask **how to book with amez points on Priceline** (a common typo for Amex). The process is the same: pay with the card, redeem on the statement.

Regarding hotel loyalty, like **how to collect hhonors points book with Priceline**, there is a catch. Most hotel chains (Hilton, Marriott) do *not* award points for third-party bookings. However, you can sometimes get lucky by presenting your loyalty card at the front desk upon check-in for "incidentals," though the room rate itself rarely earns points.

We see these searches constantly: is Priceline a good company to book with? is Priceline a good place to book a trip? is Priceline a reputable place to book a flight on?

The Verdict: Yes, But Read the Fine Print

Is Priceline a legit place to book flights? Absolutely. They are part of Booking Holdings, one of the world's largest travel companies. **Is Priceline a reliable website to book flights?** Yes, specifically for standard carriers. **Is Priceline good to book hotels?** This is their bread and butter. Their "Express Deals" offer massive discounts if you are willing to book without knowing the exact hotel name until after payment.

However, some users ask, **is Priceline horrible to book with?** Usually, complaints stem from "non-refundable" policies. If you book a "Priceline Express Deal," it is strict. No refunds. If you need flexibility, do not book the cheapest non-refundable rate.

Is Priceline a good place to book a cruise? Yes, they often offer onboard credit bonuses that you won't get booking directly with the cruise line.

People Also Ask: Deep Dives into Priceline Queries

To truly understand **how to book two different hotels on Priceline**, we need to look at the related questions travelers are asking Google.

01. Can you book a hotel for someone else on Priceline?

04. How to ensure I get my Airline Miles?

We touched on this, but the specific query **how to get airline miles whwen book on Priceline** (noting the common typo) deserves detail.

- Enter the Number at Booking: There is a field for "Frequent Flyer Number."
- 2. Verify at Check-in: When you get to the airport kiosk, scan your loyalty card.
- 3. **Keep the Receipt:** If the miles don't post, you need the ticket number (starts with 016 for United, 001 for American, etc.) to request missing credit from the airline.

Note: Some "Deep Discount" economy fares (Booking Class N, G, or similar) might earn *zero* miles or reduced miles. This is an airline rule, not a Priceline rule.

05. Is Priceline safe for International Travel?

When asking **is Priceline ok to book with** for international trips, the answer is yes, but with a caveat regarding documentation. Priceline will remind you about passports, but they are not responsible for your visas.

If you are booking a complex international itinerary involving **how to book two different hotels on Priceline** in two different countries (e.g., London and Paris), ensure you have the correct transit visas. Also, international hotel star ratings vary. A 4-star in Europe might lack air conditioning compared to a 4-star in the US. Read the reviews!

- The "Name Your Own Price" Legacy: While the bidding feature is largely gone for hotels, "Express Deals" are the modern equivalent. You can save up to 60%.
- App-Only Deals: Download the app. There are "Tonight-Only" deals that don't appear
 on the desktop site. This is great for emergency how to book two different hotels on
 Priceline scenarios where you are driving and just need a bed.
- **The 24-Hour Rule:** Most flight bookings on Priceline (to/from the US) have a 24-hour free cancellation window. This does *not* usually apply to "Express Deal" hotels.
